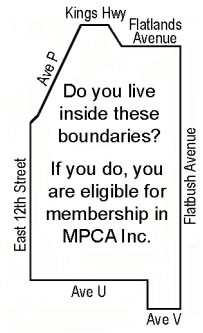

Emergency Snow Shovelers



sanitation

Get paid to help keep New Yorkers safe after winter storms.

Emergency Snow Shovelers are called on after heavy snowfalls to remove snow and ice citywide from public areas like bus stops, crosswalks and fire hydrants, and step streets.

We recruit temporary, per diem (by day) shovelers as needed.

Pay starts at **\$19.14** per hour and increases to **\$28.71** per hour after the first 40 hours worked in a week.

Eligibility

To be eligible, applicants must be:

- At least 18 years old
- Eligible to work in the United States
- Able to perform heavy physical labor

Registration

To register for an appointment, workers must have:

- Two small photos (1-1/2 inch square)
- Two original forms of ID, plus copies
- Social Security card

Get paid to clear snow and ice from bus stops, cross walks, fire hydrants, and other public areas.

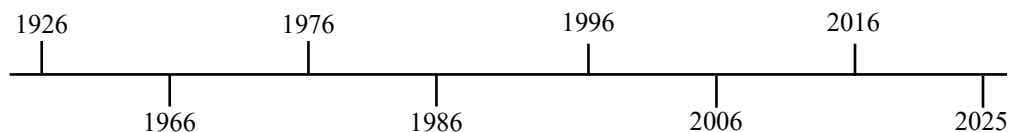

The mild November weather was such a nice treat raking leaves was barely a bother.

This year we decided to start our Christmas tree shopping early. I still like a fresh tree, though they seem to get smaller each year to save my back and a couple of bucks.

I like to shop at one of the outdoor tree markets set up around the neighborhood. Most of these temporary showcases also offer an assortment of Christmas decorations.

So one recent morning I parked on Avenue V and walked over to JJ Christmas Trees on Knapp Street just to take a look.

I spoke with a young man who was twisting Christmas wreathes by hand right there on the sidewalk. He excused himself to showcase a few trees for a potential customer who had pulled over to peruse the many different Christmas tree options. As I watched him bang and spin the trees on the sidewalk Bill, who runs the operation, came over to see if I needed anything. I told him I was just looking, and he was nice enough to show me around.

As I checked out all the various pine branch creations, resisting the urge to buy one of each, Bill explained that each piece is handmade on site by the locals who work there during the Season. My interest piqued, I asked a few questions and learned how most of these trees are trucked down from a Canadian Christmas tree farm just before Thanksgiving. He also said the majority of the young workers were from the neighborhood.

There was the usual assortment of wreaths, all decorated very nicely with bows, bells and pinecones. But the creativity also extended to tabletop decorations and ornaments.

My favorites are the small reindeer cobbled together with nothing but pine branches and twigs.

Unable to choose just one, and resisting the urge to buy one of each, I thanked and told Bill I'll be back. Hopefully on a cold calm night with light snow falling.

Emergency Weather Survival Kit

Keep these items in your vehicle
or have them with you when driving:

1. Weather-resistant outerwear appropriate to season, such as rain poncho and boots
2. Warning triangles to place around vehicle
3. Colored cloth to put on antenna or hang from window if you get stuck
4. Booster/jumper cables, plus goggles to wear when jump-starting battery
5. Tow strap or chain
6. Container of windshield washer fluid
7. Cloth towel or roll of paper towels
8. Fully charged cell phone, with adapter and cord to recharge
9. Functional spare tire
10. Basic automotive tool kit including electrical or duct tape and flexible wire
11. Basic first-aid kit
12. Multipurpose dry chemical fire extinguisher
13. List of emergency phone numbers, including your insurer and towing company
14. High-energy food, such as granola bars, trail mix, dried fruit, or nuts
15. Water (do not store in vehicle)
16. Flashlight with extra batteries
17. Candles and matches
18. Map
19. Paper and pen or pencil
20. Blanket or sleeping bag






Especially for winter
weather driving:

1. Extra cold-weather clothing: hat, scarf, gloves, coat, socks, boots
2. Tire chains
3. Bag of abrasive material, such as sand or road salt
4. Small snow shovel
5. Traction mats
6. Snow brush and ice scraper
7. Container of antifreeze
8. Lock de-icer (do not store in vehicle)



Winter Weather Driving Myth Buster

Know the facts for safe winter driving—be prepared

Myth:		Fact:
When pouring boiling water on windows, it will clear ice and snow from frozen windows. By using a hairdryer, I can thaw door locks.		Never pour hot water over icy windows to clear them. The rapid temperature change can cause glass to crack or shatter. High heat of a hairdryer could result in damaged lock sensors.
If I drive fast enough, the wind will clear the snow off my car.		Not clearing ice and snow from your vehicles is dangerous. Take time to properly clear windows, mirrors and lights.
My four-wheel and all-wheel drive vehicle is safest in winter weather. I don't need to slow down.		Best for everyone to go slow, when it comes to steering and braking in the winter weather.
I live in the south, we don't have to worry about snow and ice!		Warmer climates can experience snow or black ice when temperatures dip or melted mountain snow refreezes.
If I hit an icy patch, steering away from it will help me regain control.		Turn the front wheels in the direction you want the car to go, and as it begins to move in the correct direction, be prepared to counter steer if necessary.

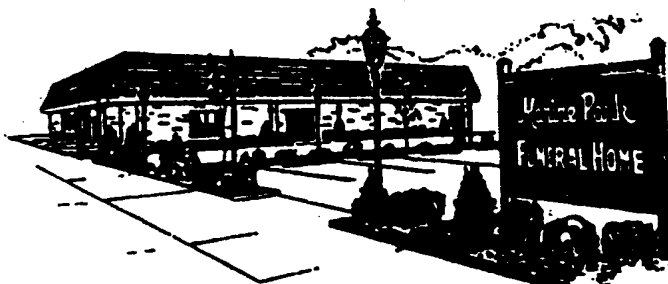
