President's Message

Our March meeting is always one of my favorites. It is highlighted by the O'Malley Irish Step Dancers. Then you to Maureen O'Malley Byrnes and all of the dancers, parents and volunteers who took time out of their evening to entertain us during the March meeting.

As many of you will recall, in the latter part of 2023, we went back and forth with City Council and representatives of the Mayor's Office about the City of Yes Program. In a unanimous vote, the City of Yes was defeated at Community Board 18. However, there are three parts to the City of Yes. The next piece of this awful legislation is going to start circulating in the various Community Boards within the next couple of months. I believe it is the residential portion of the legislation. Please be vigilant for any meetings concerning this legislation. On behalf of the MPCA, we are very much against every portion of the City of Yes legislation and we will be as vocal as we can with our opposition.

We are also in the midst of organizing a March for the Citizens of our Communities. We will meet on the block of St Columba Church (Kimball Street between Avenues U and V) on Sunday, April 14, 2024 at 12:30 pm and then March from that location to Kings Plaza to demonstrate against the use of our tax money for unvetted, illegal migrants as opposed to the people of our Communities, some of whom are in dire need of assistance. We need to help our young people with education, our veterans with the resources for their moral being and financial assistance where needed and our low-income people who contribute to our Community. It is time that we take care of our own and stop giving money away for nothing. This should be a peaceful March but our numbers need to be strong and our voices need to be loud.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the members of our Police Force who go to work every night and put their lives on the line for our safety. This is a thankless job that needs to be both recognized and protected. Anyone who wants to defund the police should stare into the eyes of Stephanie Diller, widow of Officer Jonathan Diller. This fine young man gave his life to protect members of our Community. The individual who took his life should not have been on the street. It is about time that the people who make the laws realize that the individuals that live their lives on the right side of the law, deserve protection. Sometimes, you have to admit that a recidivist with ten plus arrests might not be an upstanding member of the Community and there is no reason why law-abiding citizens should have to live in fear of meeting this person at a grocery store or gas station.

As for our police officers, I have to note that it is wrong to discriminate against individuals based on race, color, gender or sexual orientation. However, it is not against the law (at least it is not prosecuted) when the same conduct occurs to the members of the Police Department just because they wear a uniform. Unlawful conduct toward a police officer should be a hate crime. Let's ask our City Council to stop disrespecting the police and take a positive step toward protecting them.

Lastly, we are coming toward the end of our year in June. If anyone is interested in joining the MPCA board please submit a resume. We could always use the help.



Our Neighborhood - the Park

I remember as a kid taking trips down Flatbush to play in Marine Park. Softball, back when the fields were hardtop. Or basketball. For a season playing Hurricane football until I got the stockboy job at a local grocery.

To be honest the park back then did not make much of an impression on me. Flat. Square on the outside and round in the middle. A big open space looking to be occupied and utilized. So we kept it simple.

Bringing a basketball would get us 'next' in a half-court game; bringing a bag of Clinchers got a softball game going (bring your own bat and glove). A Spaldeen got us on the next open handball court. Simple.

When we moved here years later the park had just been refurbished. A new Senior Center and Bocci ball courts. Full court basketball, outdoor exercise equipment, new tennis courts and more were added or renovated. And for the kiddies a new playground.

Just recently pickle ball courts were added. And we now have new blacktop replacing the old on the oval track with new benches, lighting and water fountain installations. And though these phased construction operations creep close to the weekend softball and cricket fields, the games and matches go on. And the bicycle rentals and urban hikers are making half a Loop work for now. The temporary inconvenience tolerable with the promise of a fresh track next season.

The Park is still Flat, square on the outside and round in the middle. As plain as ever, but a funny thing. The same features that years ago seemed dull and a weak effort to provide public outdoor space now work quite nicely for this senior looking to get a little exercise. Easy going within a simple square space on a circular path. A few minutes from my house, so I can walk a couple of miles and still be a few minutes from home.

This morning, a clear sky had me put on my jacket and as I grabbed the doorknob about to take a walk, I almost stopped to turn around and yell up "Mom I'm going out!", knowing I better get back home before the streetlights came on.


