Questions to Consider Asking Your Child's Teacher

Academics:

- What is my child expected to learn, know, and do at this grade level?
- What does my child do well, and what does he or she struggle with? Can you give me examples?
- How do you know when my child is making progress and when he/she needs additional help?
- What are you doing to support and motivate him/her?
- How do you challenge my child when he/she is doing well at something?

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- How do you support my child when he/she needs extra help?
- What does my child get excited about learning?
- What can I do at home to support him/her?
- Are there programs or services in the community that could also help my child?
- How many days of school has my student missed or arrived late?

In the Classroom/School:

- Does my child seem engaged or happy at school?
- Has he/she made friends?
- How does my child get along with classmates and adults?
- Does my child participate in class discussions and group activities?

Parent Tips:

- Consider bringing your child with you to join the conversation.
- Always remember to share your own thoughts and feelings about your child.
- Describe what you see as your child's strengths and areas for growth.
- State any important information that might help your child's teacher better understand your child's approaches to learning, strengths, challenges, and interests.
- Explain where you think your child needs more support.
- Describe the best way for the teacher or school personnel to communicate with you (e.g., a note in your child's book bag, a voicemail, an e-mail, etc.).

Pre-Kindergarten Admissions

Children born in 2015 will begin pre-K in September 2019. You will be able to attend open houses and pre-k admission events. Application deadline will be March 15, 2019. Check out D22 Open Houses <u>here</u>. Visit the NYC Department of Education site <u>here</u>

Kindergarten Admissions

You will get your child's kindergarten offer in the early spring. Your offer will tell you where your child will go to kindergarten next fall. It will also tell you where your child is waitlisted. Learn more at https://www.schools.nyc.gov/enrollment/enroll-grade-by-grade/kindergarten

Gifted & Talented Admissions

If your child took the G&T test in January, you'll get their score report in the spring. Students who get a G&T test score of 90 or above will also get a G&T application. District and citywide G&T programs have different qualifying scores:

District G&T programs: Your child must get a score of 90 or above to apply to district G&T programs in the district where they live.

Citywide G&T programs: Your child must get a score of 97 or above to apply.

Middle School Admissions

In April, your child will get their middle school results. They'll get a middle school offer from the Main Round and may also get a second offer from the New Schools Round. If your child also gets an offer to a new school or program, you will have to choose between the two offers. Your results letter will include information on how to submit an appeal if you want to try to change your child's middle school placement. For more information visit

High School Admissions

Students will get Round 1 results letter later in March. This letter will include your offer from the high school application process and your results from the specialized high schools process (if you participated). These results may also include offers from any of the studios at LaGuardia High School or an offer from a testing specialized high school. If you get multiple offers in Round 1, you

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can choose only one. There is a Round 2 of high school admissions; anyone can participate. If you prefer programs available in Round 2 over your Round 1 offer(s), submit a Round 2 application. In March, you can use MySchools to explore programs with Round 2 availability. Save the date for the Round 2 High School Fair on March 30 & 31, at the Bayard Rustin Educational Campus (351 W. 18th Street in Manhattan)-time to follow. Multilingual Learners

The New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Test: will be given between April 8 and May 17. Schools can test eligible students any time during this period.

Special Education

Parent members of the IEP team contribute valuable information and support to families who request their attendance at an IEP meeting. Parent members participate in discussions about:

- Eligibility for special education services
- Educational planning and goal-setting
- Learning in the Least Restrictive Environment (LRE)
- Understanding the evaluation and placement processes

They help to ensure that the student's family member(s):

- Understand and are comfortable with the IEP team's decisions
- Have had their questions and concerns addressed

Parent & School Leadership

- PA/PTA:
 - o **Form Budget Committee:** The budget committee shall include but are not limited to: a) review prior year's budget and make recommendations to the executive board; b) draft a proposed budget each spring for approval by general membership. The proposed budget must be presented to and approved by the membership no later than the June meeting.

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o **Form Audit Committee**: It is recommended that an internal audit be conducted once every year, preferably before submitting the PA/PTA's Annual Financial Report. The audit committee must be selected by the general membership and be comprised of a majority of general members. Signatories of PA/PTA checks may not serve on or guide the work of an audit committee. The audit must include a review of PA/PTA or records, as defined in Section III. E.1. The audit committee's findings must be reported to the membership at the next general membership meeting and recorded in the meeting minutes. PA/PTA audit committees must provide a copy of their findings to the principal. CR A-660 III, E1 and G.




Some of our many District 22 Black History Month Celebrations:


